

DEED OF FOUNDATION OF THE BUDAPEST UNIVERSITY OF TECHNOLOGY AND ECONOMICS

Exercising its powers under Section 8 (4) and Section 73 (3) a) of Act CCIV of 2011 on National Higher Education (hereinafter: Higher Education Act), the BME Fenntartó Zrt., as the entity exercising maintainer's rights (hereinafter: Maintainer), establishes and issues the Deed of Foundation of the Budapest University of Technology and Economics (hereinafter: University) in accordance with the Higher Education Act as follows.

The adoption, amendment and issuance of this Deed of Foundation fall within the competence of the Board of Directors of BME Fenntartó Zrt, in accordance with its Statutes.

II. LEGAL STATUS OF THE UNIVERSITY

1. According to Sections 2 (1) and (3) of Act CCIV of 2011 on National Higher Education, the University is a public benefit institution with the aim of pursuing educational and scientific activities, which include in particular bachelor training programmes, master training programmes, doctoral programmes and postgraduate specialist training programmes, as well as the completion of part of a programme. The University aims to contribute to the sustainable development of the national economy and society through education, research, development and innovation in the fields of engineering, information technology, natural sciences, social sciences, economics and agriculture, while preserving

its traditions and values and strengthening its outstanding role at the international level. In pursuit of these goals the University aims to:

- 1.1. provide high quality, internationally attractive and competitive training programmes;
 - 1.2. conduct internationally recognised research that contributes to addressing social challenges and advancing technological development;
 - 1.3. ensure quality-focused operations, the continuous development of institutional quality culture, transparency, and strict adherence to ethical standards;
 - 1.4. strengthen international engagement and expand the University's regional and global collaborations, while maintaining its leading role in the domestic market;
 - 1.5. enforce sustainability considerations in education, research and in all areas of the University's operations;
 - 1.6. preserve and promote the physical and mental health of its student and employee community, and strengthen the university community – including the alumni community;
 - 1.7. promote the establishment and development of a knowledge- and innovation-based society and economy through its third mission activities.
2. According to Annex 1 of Act CCIV of 2011 on National Higher Education, Budapest University of Technology and Economics is a state accredited higher education institution in Hungary.
 3. Pursuant to Section 4 (1a) of Act CCIV of 2011 on National Higher Education, Budapest University of Technology and Economics is a higher education institution maintained by a company with a registered seat in Hungary. Its revenues derive from: the financing provided by the state under the general framework agreement for the provision of higher education services and the agreement for the provision of higher education services, financial resources provided by the Maintainer, industrial contracts, grant funding, self-financed programmes, alumni contributions and other revenues.
 4. Pursuant to Section 5 (1) of Act CCIV of 2011 on National Higher Education, Budapest University of Technology and Economics is a legal entity.
 5. Pursuant to the provisions of Act CCIV of 2011 on National Higher Education, Act CLXXV of 2011 on the Freedom of Association, Public Benefit Status and the Operation and Funding of Non-Governmental Organisations, and on the basis of the register maintained by the Educational Authority, Budapest University of Technology and Economics operates as a public benefit organisation.
 6. Pursuant to Section 3 (4) of Act CCIV of 2011 on National Higher Education – and in accordance with the Act on Adult Education – Budapest University of Technology and Economics carries out adult education activities.

7. Duties, rights and obligations of the Maintainer:
 - 7.1. Pursuant to Section 2 (2) of the Higher Education Act, the Maintainer is responsible for the operation of the University.
 - 7.2. The Maintainer exercises the maintainer's control provided for in Section 73 (1) of the Higher Education Act, in this regard in accordance with Sections 73–75 of the Act, and furthermore on the basis of the authorisation granted in Section 94 (6) of the Act:
 - 7.2.1. the Maintainer adopts, amends and issues the University's Deed of Foundation, with the provision that
 - 7.2.1.1. in the cases specified in Section IV.10.2.1 of the Deed of Foundation, the Senate has the right of consent regarding amendments thereto;
 - 7.2.1.2. The Senate has the power of consultation regarding the Deed of Foundation as a whole and any amendments thereto.
 - 7.2.2. the Maintainer defines the framework of the University's development plans and approves the Institutional Development Plan adopted by the Senate;
 - 7.2.3. the Maintainer defines the framework of the University's budget and approves the budget adopted by the Senate;
 - 7.2.4. the Maintainer reviews and approves the annual report prepared in accordance with accounting regulations and adopted by the Senate;
 - 7.2.5. the Maintainer approves the asset management plan adopted by the Senate;
 - 7.2.6. following adoption by the Senate, the Maintainer reviews and approves:
 - 7.2.6.1. the University's Organisational and Operational Provisions (Part 1 of the Rules of Organisation and Operation) and its amendments,
 - 7.2.6.2. the rules forming part of the Employment Requirements System (Part 2 of the Rules of Organisation and Operation), relating to the employment law framework, job positions, basic job requirements and the associated rules on promotion, performance evaluation and performance development, remuneration, as well as the principles of recruitment and selection, together with their amendments,
 - 7.2.6.3. the Code of fees and benefits, forming part of the Student Requirements System (Part 3 of the Rules of Organisation and Operation), together with its amendments.
 - 7.3. The parts of the Employment Requirements System and the Student Requirements System in respect of which the Maintainer has no right of approval shall be forwarded

by the Rector, as chair of the Senate, to the Maintainer for the purpose of ensuring the exercise of the maintainer's rights set out in Sections 73–75 of the Higher Education Act.

- 7.4. The Maintainer may initiate with the Rector the amendment of the Rules of Organisation and Operation (including the Organisational and Operational Provisions, the Employment Requirements System and the Student Requirements System), and such initiatives must be deliberated by the Senate upon the Rector's proposal.
- 7.5. Prior authorisation of the Maintainer is required for:
 - 7.5.1. the establishment of a business entity by the University, as well as the purchase, transfer or acquisition of an equity interest in a business entity by the University, and the transfer thereof;
 - 7.5.2. any commitment for a development or investment not included in the business plan exceeding the value limit of HUF 100 million, as well as any commitment for a development or investment included in the business plan exceeding the value limit of HUF 500 million;
 - 7.5.3. participation in domestic or international tenders where the amount of the University's own contribution exceeds HUF 100 million
- 7.6. If the Maintainer concludes or amends a general framework agreement for the provision of higher education services and/or an agreement for the provision of higher education services with the ministry responsible for higher education pursuant to the Higher Education Act, the consent of the Senate is required.
- 7.7. The approval of the Maintainer is required for the establishment of the University's annual training activities – in particular the programmes to be launched, the modes of delivery of training and the planned student capacity per programme.
- 7.8. Following adoption by the Senate, the Maintainer approves the transfer to the University of the maintainer's rights over a public education institution.
- 7.9. It falls within the Maintainer's competence to announce the call for applications for the position of Rector, to initiate with the Minister the appointment and dismissal of the Rector, to exercise the employer's rights over the Rector, as well as to appoint and dismiss the Director General for Financial and Technical Affairs. The employer's rights vested in the Maintainer are set out in more detail in Part IV, Sections 11 and 12.
- 7.10. Further powers of the Maintainer in the scope of employment:
 - 7.10.1. the prior consultation on the appointment of a Vice-Rector, which, if the candidate is named in the Rector's application, is conducted together with the consultation on the Rector's application, and if it takes place outside the Rector's application, is conducted in a separate consultation procedure;
 - 7.10.2. the approval of the appointment and dismissal of non-academic executives under the direct supervision of the Rector.

- 7.11. The Maintainer shall furthermore have all rights and bear all obligations defined by the Higher Education Act and the relevant legislation for the maintainers of private higher education institutions.

IV. ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE OF THE UNIVERSITY

1. The University shall establish and maintain an organisational unit specified in its Organisational and Operational Provisions for the performance of its tasks as defined in this Deed of Foundation.
2. The University consists of the following organisational units:
 - 2.1. management, general staff,
 - 2.2. educational, research and development, innovation, knowledge transfer, complex talent management, as well as related supplementary units,
 - 2.3. service and
 - 2.4. operational units.
3. The organisational units performing management, general staff and operational tasks are the offices, directorates and independent departments.
4. The organisational framework for carrying out educational, research and development, innovation and related supplementary activities comprises the following types of organisational units:
 - 4.1. faculties
 - 4.2. institutes,
 - 4.3. departments,
 - 4.4. doctoral schools,
 - 4.5. research institutions,
 - 4.6. research centres,
 - 4.7. knowledge centres,
 - 4.8. laboratories,
5. The organisational framework for carrying out complex talent management activities comprises the following types of organisational units and bodies:
 - 5.1. colleges for advanced studies,
 - 5.2. competitive teams,
 - 5.3. student voluntary groups,
 - 5.4. student delegation.
6. The organisational framework for carrying out service activities comprises the centres.

7. Pursuant to Act CXVI of 1996 on Atomic Energy, the University operates a training reactor for educational and research purposes, which qualifies as a nuclear facility and constitutes a licensed activity.
8. Pursuant to the Act on Museums, Public Libraries and Cultural Community Services, the University's organisational unit with special legal status is the National Technical Information Centre and Library, which functions as a public, national specialist library.
9. Within the framework of this Deed of Foundation, the University's Organisational and Operational Provisions defines the organisational structure, subdivisions, management structure, decision-making procedures, the procedure for the application and selection of executives, as well as the tasks and operation of the individual organisational units.
10. Senate
 - 10.1. The University's governing body is the Senate. The Senate is chaired by the Rector. The Senate is vested with the rights of a higher education institution as set out in the Fundamental Law and the Higher Education Act.
 - 10.2. Within the framework of the division of powers between the Senate and the Maintainer, the Senate shall:
 - 10.2.1. prior to the Maintainer's adoption or amendment, exercise its power of consultation on the University's Deed of Foundation, and, with regard to the provisions set out in Sections VI and VII of the Deed of Foundation, exercise its power of consent concerning amendments to the Deed of Foundation;
 - 10.2.2. adopt the University's Institutional Development Plan, budget, annual report prepared in accordance with accounting regulations, and asset management plan, which become valid upon the Maintainer's approval;
 - 10.2.3. adopt the University's Rules of Organisation and Operation (its Organisational and Operational Provisions, Employment Requirements System and Student Requirements System), which, within the scope defined in the Deed of Foundation, become valid upon the Maintainer's approval;
 - 10.2.4. exercise its power of consent in the conclusion and amendment of the general framework agreement for the provision of higher education services, as well as the agreement for the provision of higher education services under the Higher Education Act, concluded between the Maintainer and the ministry responsible for higher education.
 - 10.3. Within the framework of this Deed of Foundation, the composition of the Senate, the rules governing its establishment, its competences, functions and further powers are set out in the Organisational and Operational Provisions.
11. Rector
 - 11.1. The University shall be headed and represented by the rector.
 - 11.2. The University is headed by the Rector. The Rector is responsible for the lawful, economical and efficient operation of the University. Within this, the Rector shall:
 - 11.2.1. manage the University's educational, adult education, information and counselling, talent management, scientific, research-development and

- innovation activities, as well as the tasks related to enhancing the social recognition of science;
- 11.2.2. coordinate the higher education institution's educational, scientific, research-development, innovation, grant-related and other collaborations with other higher education institutions, national organisations and bodies of higher education, governmental and municipal authorities, corporate partners, civil organisations and other institutions;
- 11.2.3. be responsible for:
- 11.2.3.1. creating the University's mission statement, mission and vision, as well as its long- and medium-term strategies and development plans; implementing and monitoring these strategies and development plans; and performing the tasks defined for the University by the Maintainer;
 - 11.2.3.2. domestic and international educational and research relations and cooperation;
 - 11.2.3.3. ensuring that the University's training programmes comply with the relevant legal provisions and with the training and outcome requirements established by the competent minister;
 - 11.2.3.4. organising HR and administrative activities, and ensuring that the University's internal regulations comply with legal requirements, are coherent and enforceable, and that the University's operation is in line with domestic and European Union data protection legislation;
 - 11.2.3.5. organising and operating the University's compliance activities;
 - 11.2.3.6. issuing decisions, initiatives and applications made within the scope of the University's core activities;
- 11.2.4. through the Director General for Financial and Technical Affairs, direct the operation of the University, and in this context be responsible for the University's economic, financial, controlling, accounting, labour, operational, legal and IT activities, as well as for the University's asset management, including technical, facility utilisation, operational, logistical, service, procurement and public procurement matters;
- 11.2.5. through the Director General for Financial and Technical Affairs, ensure the conditions necessary for the University's management in order to secure the performance of its tasks by utilising the resources available to the University;
- 11.2.6. exercise the ownership rights in business entities and economic organisations in which the University participates;
- 11.2.7. liaise with representative bodies, the university student union and the doctoral student union;
- 11.2.8. exercise publishing rights and copyrights.

- 11.3. The Rector, with the exception of granting and withdrawing the appointment of the Director General for Financial and Technical Affairs, exercises employer's rights over the employees of the University, and also exercises the rights of client in case of agency contracts.
- 11.4. The Rector may delegate their powers in certain predefined matters or on a case-by-case basis, to their deputy, to the dean of a faculty, or to another employee of the University, as set out in internal regulatory documents. The person exercising delegated power may not subdelegate that power.
- 11.5. The Rector shall act and decide in all matters that are not assigned by law, by this Deed of Foundation, or by the Rules of Organisation and Operation to another authority.
- 11.6. The office of Rector may be filled through a public application process.
- 11.7. The detailed rules relating to the application procedure and the appointment are set out in the Rules of Organisation and Operation, provided that, pursuant to the authorisation set out in Section 94 (6a) of the Higher Education Act, by way of derogation from Section 12 (3) d):
 - 11.7.1. the Senate shall make a proposal regarding the content of the call for applications for the position of Rector;
 - 11.7.2. the Maintainer shall decide on the content of the call for applications, shall issue the call for applications, and may also establish a committee to examine the validity of the applications.
 - 11.7.3. The valid applications for the position of Rector shall be consulted on and ranked by the Senate as follows:
 - 11.7.3.1. If an applicant obtains the affirmative votes of at least two-thirds of the Senate members, this shall qualify as a nomination, and the Chair of the Senate shall submit this candidate to the Maintainer. The Maintainer may submit for appointment to the President of the Republic of Hungary the candidate put forward by the Chair of the Senate who has submitted a valid application and obtained at least two-thirds support.
 - 11.7.3.2. If none of the applicants obtains the affirmative votes of two-thirds of the Senate members, the Senate shall rank the applicants, and the Chair of the Senate shall submit all applicants to the Maintainer, indicating the ranking established by the Senate. In full knowledge of the Senate's ranking, the Maintainer shall decide whether:
 - 11.7.3.2.1. it submits for appointment to the President of the Republic of Hungary the candidate who has received the greatest endorsement from the Senate, but at least the majority (50% plus one member) support of the Senate and has submitted a valid application, or

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- 11.7.3.2.2. it initiates a consultation with the Senate to be conducted in accordance with Sections IV.11.7.3.3 and IV.11.7.3.4 in order to select the most suitable candidate.
 - 11.7.3.3. The consultation shall be initiated with the Chair of the Senate within 10 days following the submission of the Senate's ranking to the Maintainer. The consultation shall be concluded within 60 days from its initiation.
 - 11.7.3.4. The outcome of the consultation may be that:
 - 11.7.3.4.1. following the consultation, but without a new Senate vote, the Maintainer submits for appointment to the President of the Republic of Hungary the candidate who has received the greatest endorsement from the Senate, but at least the majority (50% plus one member) support of the Senate and has submitted a valid application, or
 - 11.7.3.4.2. at the initiative of the Maintainer or by decision of the Senate, the Senate shall vote again on the applicants, in which case the rectoral candidate shall be the one who has received the greatest endorsement from the Senate, but at least the majority (50% plus one member) support of the Senate.
 - 11.8. The Rector shall be appointed for a term of up to 5 years and dismissed by the President of the Republic of Hungary. The same person may be appointed at the University as Rector no more than twice in total, regardless of the term of office.
 - 11.9. With the exception of appointment and dismissal, the employer's rights over the Rector are exercised by the Maintainer.
 - 11.10. If the Rector is prevented from performing their duties for more than 30 days, in case of conflict of interest, or a vacancy in the office of Rector, the vice-rector designated by the Maintainer shall be entitled to act as the Rector's substitute, serving as the head of the University and the Senate, and the employer's rights over the vice-rector shall be exercised by the Maintainer. In all other respects, the rules governing the substitution of the Rector are set out in the Organisational and Operational Provisions.
 - 11.11. If the office of Rector is vacant, the Maintainer shall announce the call for applications in such a time that the application procedure conducted on the basis thereof is concluded within 9 months.
 12. Director General for Financial and Technical Affairs
 - 12.1. On the basis of the authorisation granted in Section 94 (2) of the Higher Education Act, the University employs a Director General for Financial and Technical Affairs, as a senior executive officer (executive employee), who also performs the functions of chief financial officer as defined in the Higher Education Act.
 - 12.2. The Director General for Financial and Technical Affairs, is responsible for preparing economic management measures and proposals.

- 12.3. In the course of fulfilling the provisions set out in Section IV.12.2, the Director General for Financial and Technical Affairs, under the Rector's direction, manages the operation of the University, and in this capacity is responsible for the University's economic, financial, controlling, accounting, human resources, operational, legal, and information technology activities, as well as for the University's asset management, including technical, facility utilisation, operation, logistics, service, procurement, and public procurement matters.
- 12.4. The Rector shall be consulted on the candidate(s) for the position of Director General for Financial and Technical Affairs, and submit it to the Maintainer, who then decides on the position.
- 12.5. With the exception of appointment, dismissal and remuneration, the employer's rights over the Director General for Financial and Technical Affairs, are exercised by the Rector.

V. THE UNIVERSITY'S CORE ACTIVITIES AND OTHER ACTIVITIES

1. The University's core activity (as defined by the goals and deemed as a public-benefit activity) is education and scientific research.
2. In the course of its educational activities, the University:
 - 2.1. May offer bachelor training programmes, multi-cycle and single-cycle master training programmes and postgraduate specialist training programmes, and issue diplomas; it may also provide completion of part of a programme and issue micro-credentials, as well as conduct preparatory programmes, in fields of training defined in this Deed of Foundation.
 - 2.2. The University conducts doctoral programmes and habilitation procedures and confers doctoral degrees in the areas of science defined in this Deed of Foundation, as well as in interdisciplinary fields.
 - 2.3. The University carries out basic research, applied research, experimental development, as well as other research supporting education; furthermore, it engages in technological innovation, technology and knowledge transfer activities, and research management in the areas of science related to education.
 - 2.4. It helps preparing students to become intellectuals by mediating, cultivating and developing national and universal culture and arts, and developing mother tongue and foreign language skills.
 - 2.5. It ensures talent management and the training of future lecturers and researchers.
3. In the course of its complementary and service activities related to the University's core activities (as defined by the goals and deemed as a public-benefit activity):
 - 3.1. It publishes textbooks and course books, and develops teaching aids. It provides students with textbooks and course books, academic counselling, library and laboratory services, residence hall accommodation, cultural and sports opportunities, as well as services supporting their integration and healthy lifestyle.
 - 3.2. It carries out activities related to the distribution and disbursement of student allowances.

- 3.3. It provides students with training programmes and services that are not directly related to the fulfilment of the academic requirements set out in the training and outcome requirements. It organises preparatory courses for university admission, language preparatory courses, further training, other courses, and language training.
 - 3.4. It participates in the implementation of vocational training tasks not qualified as higher education programmes and other training tasks defined in sectoral laws, pursuant to the applicable National Higher Education Act, the Act on Vocational Training, the Act on National Public Education and the Act on Adult Education.
 - 3.5. It establishes and maintains international relations necessary to provide high-quality education and research. In this context, it cooperates with domestic and foreign higher education institutions and research institutes in the fields of education and research, and promotes employee and student mobility.
 - 3.6. It provides general library and archival services in the fields of engineering, social sciences and economic sciences, as well as national specialised technical library services. It carries out public collection activities and performs tasks in general education.
 - 3.7. It publishes and distributes professional journals and periodicals.
 - 3.8. It organises national and international conferences and carries out consulting activities in the fields of study and disciplines defined in its Deed of Foundation.
 - 3.9. It operates sports facilities. It utilises the free capacities of its infrastructure as an activity supporting the performance of its core tasks, without the purpose of profit-making.
4. Business activities:
 - 4.1. The University may engage in business activities only insofar as they do not endanger its core activities.
 - 4.2. The upper limit of business activities is not restricted, except as provided by law.
 5. The University provides its training programmes, or parts thereof, within the framework of its core educational activities, as activities not serving commercial purposes.
 6. The classification of the University's activities according to TEÁOR (NACE) is contained in Annex 1.

VI. LEVELS (TYPES), FIELDS OF STUDY OR ACADEMIC DISCIPLINES, AND LOCATIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION PROGRAMMES CONDUCTED AT THE UNIVERSITY

1. The University provides education at the following training locations, levels of training (types of programmes), fields of study and areas of science pursuant to point 16a of Section 108 of the Higher Education Act:

2. Maximum number of students that may be admitted: 26,500

VIII. PUBLIC-BENEFIT ACTIVITIES OF THE UNIVERSITY

1. The University may engage in business activities only insofar as they do not endanger its core activities.
2. The University does not engage in direct political activity; its organisation is independent of political parties and does not provide them with financial support.
3. The University does not distribute the profits earned through its business operations; it allocates them to its public-benefit activities.
4. The body supervising the University's operation and management, separate from the Senate, is the Public Benefit Supervisory Committee. The Public Benefit Supervisory

Committee consists of 3 members, one of whom performs the duties of the chair. The members and the chair are appointed by the Maintainer for a fixed term of up to 3 years, which may be extended multiple times.

5. The members of the Public Benefit Supervisory Committee are subject to the grounds for exclusion set out in Sections 3:22 (1)–(6), 3:26 (2), and 3:115 (1)–(2) of Act V of 2013 on the Civil Code, as well as to the rules on decision-making and conflict of interest set out in Section 38 (3) and Section 39 (1)–(2) of Act CLXXV of 2011 on the Right of Association, Public Benefit Status and the Operation and Funding of Non-Governmental Organisations.
6. In the course of its activities, the Public Benefit Supervisory Committee may request reports from the University's executive employees (executive officers), request information or clarification from its employees, and may inspect and examine the University's books and records.
7. The Public Benefit Supervisory Committee shall establish its own rules of procedure.

IX. THE REAL ESTATE ASSETS MADE AVAILABLE TO THE UNIVERSITY, AND ITS ASSET MANAGEMENT RIGHTS OVER THOSE ASSETS

1. The list of real estate properties used by the University is included in Annex 2.

X. GLOSSARY

1. The terms used in this Deed of Foundation shall be interpreted as follows:
 - 1.1. Power of authorisation: The person or body vested with the power of authorisation is entitled and at the same time obliged to either grant procedural freedom to the applicant in respect of the measure or action forming the subject of the request for authorisation, or to reject it. Until the authorisation is granted, the applicant is not entitled to carry out, in whole or in part, the measure or action that is the subject of the authorisation request; however, preparatory work not involving the assumption of obligations may be performed. The authorising party shall provide justification for refusing the authorisation and is entitled to offer opinions or suggestions to the applicant.
 - 1.2. Power of approval: After the decision has been made, the person or body vested with the power of approval is entitled and at the same time obliged, either to confirm the decision of the decision-maker or to refuse its confirmation. If the approving party confirms the decision, the decision becomes valid upon approval; if the approving party refuses to confirm the decision, the decision does not take effect, the procedure is terminated, and a new decision-making and approval procedure must be initiated in order to reach a decision. The approving party shall provide justification for refusing approval and is entitled to offer opinions or suggestions to the person who made the refused decision.
 - 1.3. Power of proposal: The person or body vested with the power of proposal is entitled, in matters within the scope of that power, either at the request of the decision-maker or on its own authority, to formulate a general or text-specific idea, initiative, or recommendation. The decision-maker is not bound by the proposal.

- 1.4. Power of consultation: The person or body vested with the power of consultation is entitled, and at the same time obliged, in matters within the scope of that power, to deliver an opinion prior to decision-making and to make general or text-specific comments on any part of the matter. The decision-maker is not bound by the opinion.
- 1.5. Power of joint decision (consent): The persons or bodies vested with the power of joint decision are jointly entitled and obliged to make their decision; however, if any of them rejects a given proposal, or if the joint decision-makers cannot reach a compromise, the proposal shall not be adopted, the procedure shall be terminated, and a new decision-making procedure must be initiated in order to reach a decision.

XI. FINAL PROVISIONS

1. This Deed of Foundation was adopted by the Maintainer through Board Resolution No. 2/2025 (21 July) and was signed by the representative of the Maintainer. This Deed of Foundation shall enter into force on 21 July 2025.
